Annual Event – 9 November 2022 Evaluation and Looking Ahead

Headlines



- HCCSP held our first in person event on 9 November 2022.
- 121 attendees (153 registered)
- Local Authority representation counted for less than half the total number of attendees (47%)

– This was better than previous events which were >50%

- Qualitative and quantitative feedback was received
- Budget: under £1300 for venue hire and associated costs



Event aims


- To engage with 100+ stakeholders from across Hertfordshire
- Wide **representation** of public and private
- Inform and inspire on HCCSP work and a 'call to action' (on adaptation)

• Quality, good value, sustainable event



Event outcomes


- ✓ **Popular: 121 attendees** (153 pre-registered)
- Representative: Balance between private, community and Local Authority representation
- ✓ Evaluated: Qualitative and quantitative feedback received from 46 (40%)
- ✓ Cost-effective: <£10 per head
- Future processes embedded:
 - Full event plan template
 - Health & safety and risk processes
 - Stakeholder mailing list



Geography of attendees




- Event attendees came from all over Hertfordshire
- Every district and borough was represented
- A third of attendees identified as 'Hertfordshire-wide'

Feedback:

What is the one key thing that you took from today?

- Partnership work
 - 'Key work and partnership working is being done in Hertfordshire at a high level.'
 - 'Progress will only be made if partners work collaboratively.'
 - 'We're all in it together. Whether we are working for councils or local groups, businesses or amenities, we all care passionately...'
 - 'That local government in partnership with NGOs, local businesses and others is critical to the delivery of measures to address the challenges of Climate Change and Sustainability.'





- Adaptation knowledge gained:
 - 'Adaptation is crucial in order to future proof the Country and make it more resilient to the impacts of climate change.'
 - 'Process for carrying out a climate risk assessment and producing a climate adaptation plan.'
 - 'Adaptations must be put onto risk register.'
- The importance of **Behaviour Change**:
 - The speaker and presentation from the Behaviour Change Unit was regarded positively.

- 74% agreed: "Has this event given you an update and further understanding about HCCSP"
- 81% would attend a future HCCSP event

- Event length and content limited by very small budget.
