

# Hertfordshire Climate Change and Sustainability Partnership

Strategic Action Plan: Net Zero Carbon Across Hertfordshire

**Draft review September 2023** 

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#### 1. Introduction

- 1.1 This Strategic Action Plan outlines the Hertfordshire Climate Change & Sustainability Partnership's (HCCSP) contribution to achieving net-zero CO<sub>2</sub>e emissions across Hertfordshire by 2050, if not before.
- 1.2 HCCSP works collaboratively to accelerate action on climate and environmental targets, using direct and indirect policy where possible, legislation, influence, and encouragement. It aims to achieve a sustainable environment for current and future communities.
- 1.3 All HCCSP members have set a carbon reduction ambition for their own operations and the geography of their individual local authorities. This action plan looks at what we can influence collectively to reduce emissions across the whole county.
- 1.4 This Strategic Action Plan addresses issues related to carbon emission, primarily in the building and energy sectors. It will link with other Strategic Action Plans within HCCSP and other strategic stakeholders across the county and region.

#### 2. Vision for the Future

Hertfordshire will be a CO<sub>2</sub>e net zero county with resilient neighbourhoods, where residents, businesses and community groups will thrive through a healthy lifestyle, green economy and access to nature.


#### 3. Current Position and Progress

- 3.1 Data from DESNZ estimate that Hertfordshire emits about 5,967.4 ktCO<sub>2</sub>e (2021) with 4.6% (280.1 kt CO<sub>2</sub>e) coming from the public sector<sup>1</sup>.
- 3.2 This action plan will limit its scope to CO₂e emissions from domestic, and business sectors. Transport, waste and agriculture will be discussed with the relevant groups and networks.


3.3 Taking estimations from DESNZ, the current CO<sub>2</sub>e emissions (excluding transport, waste and agriculture) for Hertfordshire County are as below:

## CO2e emission in Hertfordshire (excluding transport)



- 3.4 Due to Covid 19 the potential impacts of human activities on CO₂e emission means 2020 reduction is less comparable than other year.
- 3.5 However, there is still a reduction of about 100kt CO<sub>2</sub>e between 2018 and 2021.
- 3.6 Partners will continue to keep track of DESNZ CO₂e emission estimations.

3.7 Partners of HCCSP have individually determined their net-zero targets' dates (Annexe 1) which can be reflected into a pathway towards net-zero emission by  $2050^2$ .

- 3.8 In 2021, Hertfordshire had a population of around 1.2 million, consuming electricity and gas with an equivalent carbon emission of **3,049.2 ktCO<sub>2</sub>e<sup>3</sup>**.
- 3.9 Domestic CO<sub>2</sub>e emission (68%) is higher than the commercial and industry combined (32%).
- 3.10 In 2020, there were more than 540,000 electric and gas meters in Hertfordshire, where just under 500,000 are of domestic use. The data used are based on the countywide consumption figures for gas and electricity as analysed by Herts Insight.
- 3.11 A thorough and detailed analysis of Hertfordshire's previous carbon emissions are included in the <u>HCCSP's Strategic Action Plan for Carbon</u> <u>Reduction 2021.</u>

## 4. Key Actors and Stakeholders

- 4.1 Partners identified a range of actions that will need various stakeholders' engagement at different level. The actions need a collaborative approach with businesses, local communities, statutory bodies and infrastructure companies.
- 4.2 HCCSP partners will create a stakeholder plan based on:

4.3 The subgroup will support HCCSP to lobby relevant bodies such as central government and key anchor institutions, where ambition is hindered by legislative or policy barriers.

## 5. Key Aims


- **5.1** The partners have identified the following objectives:
- To establish which issues Hertfordshire needs to tackle to reduce CO<sub>2</sub>e
  emissions, and where local government bodies can identify and create
  meaningful changes and actions to reduce carbon emissions.

- Estimate costs, procurement mechanisms and identify funding sources that can be used for future projects.
- Provide an engagement approach for internal and external stakeholders to combine efforts in delivering carbon emission reductions for Hertfordshire County.
- Accelerate Hertfordshire County towards net zero, focusing on reducing demand through energy efficiency, retrofitting and new net zero buildings; a low carbon energy system; and offsetting and insetting.

#### 5.2 The expected outcomes will include:

- An action plan to reduce Hertfordshire's carbon footprint.
- A stakeholder engagement plan to help deliver the actions.
- A set of tools, procurement mechanisms and funding sources to use in collaborative projects.
- Maximising the environmental, social, and economic opportunities of CO<sub>2</sub>e reduction.
- Residents, businesses and community groups acting alongside the partnership to achieve Net-Zero.
- 5.3 The scope of this action plan has been limited to reducing fossil fuel generation, consumption and therefore demand.
- The actions will focus on the two main sectors that emit large amount of CO<sub>2</sub>e: retrofitting buildings (domestic and commercial) and decarbonisation of the energy system. It will also consider actions on prevention, knowledge transfer, training, facilitating deliveries and offsetting options for local authorities. Finally, it will identify the relevant stakeholders to engage with.
- CO<sub>2</sub>e emissions from other sources, such as transport, are the subject of other HCCSP Action Plans.

5.4 The method used will follow the carbon Net-Zero hierarchy



- Partners will align actions to reducing the use of fossil fuels, in the first instance, and considering offsetting emissions as a last solution.
- 5.5 Several specifics need to be considered when looking at achieving the net zero goal.
- The socio-economic variation within the county.
- The level of funding available.
- The level of skills, material, and labour resource available.
- The policy context.
- The level of influence and control local authorities has.
- The existing energy infrastructure.
- 5.6 The partners will take these into account when developing actions on how to best overcome them.
- 5.7 Retrofit buildings
- Accelerating retrofitting for different audiences by providing an overview of what is already available, where opportunities can be developed.
- Empowering the relevant stakeholders to find funding, skills and increase the behaviour change to retrofitting.

 With an ambitious outcome to reduce energy demand and increase the green economy in Hertfordshire.

## 5.8 Net-Zero on new buildings

- Establish a collaborative way of exchanging information for stakeholders to progress their part in the developers' supply chain and share approaches from across the country,
- To work with stakeholders to lobby government to accelerate buildings regulations and standards towards net zero.

## 5.9 Energy strategy for the County

- Contributing to the Local Energy Plan. The partners will be engaged with the delivery of decarbonising the grid for Hertfordshire population.
- Collaborating to identify stakeholders and providing relevant information to expedite the project when necessary.
- Assessing local energy pathways (and commenting on the progress of the assessment and proposed pathways) to ensure it is deliverable and match the net zero targets.
- Assess what projects can be assisted by HCCSP.
- 5.10 Offsetting the emissions that cannot be reduced or replaced.
- Setting out what is meant by offsetting, how this relates to carbon credits and internal carbon sequestration approaches.
- Developing a clear policy to facilitate effective, compliant, and monitored offsetting, prioritising 'in county' projects.
- Coordinating expertise and best practice protocols to create policy guidance for local authorities that will benefit local economy and coordinate offset and inset carbon for Hertfordshire.
- Investigating insetting: the difference to offsetting, its application and definition

#### 6. Context

- 6.1 HCCSP has a role to play as a strategic convener, preparing and sharing content to respond to Central Government and other consultation exercises. This may be as individual partners, via professionally recognised bodies or organisations (such as the Association of Directors of Environment, Economy, Planning & Transport (ADEPT) or the Chartered Institute of Environmental Health (CIEH)), or as a collective response via the Partnership.
- 6.2 There are also other routes via the Local Government Association, which provides a voice for local government on the national stage, lobbying on councils' key priorities as they work with parliamentarians to inform debates, support the scrutiny of legislation and engage with select committees and all-party parliamentary groups. HCCSP and partners, may wish to respond via the Regional Climate Change Forum, the LGA Climate Action Group or the wider LGA.
- 6.3 Climate change is the greatest challenge facing our society. There is a need and statutory obligation (Climate Change Act 2008) on councils to prepare for and minimise the longer-term impacts of climate change. This is reinforced by expectations for community resilience and business continuity by service users, residents and businesses.
- 6.4 As local authorities we are responsible for the services we provide, with many being functions that are required by legislation and the services delivered on our behalf. We cannot tackle the issues related to climate change alone. From a local government perspective Hertfordshire is comprised of 11 local authorities; the county council and 10 district and borough councils. We are committed to working collaboratively to make a real difference.
- 6.5 There are over 1.2 million people living and working in Hertfordshire and about 69,700 businesses (2021 Herts Insight). By working collaboratively with the county's district and borough councils and other public organisations, communities and local businesses we can deliver our services more sustainably and enable and inspire others to take action.

- 6.6 As local councils, our strongest influence is over our own services and activities: those functions that we are responsible for delivering, for example the preparation of local plans, determining planning applications, procuring goods and services. However, there is a clear acknowledgment that local authorities have a much wider scope of influence.
- 6.7 We are increasingly ambitious in our plans to tackle climate change. As of May 2023, nine out of the ten local authorities across Hertfordshire have declared climate emergencies with associated targets, with the other two setting priorities and strategic aims around the climate change agenda. Many now have plans to deliver against these ambitious Net Zero targets or are in the process of developing them.
- 6.8 Local authorities have a range of existing levers that can be used to deliver local action that reduces emissions and prepares local areas for a changing climate. The Partnership is enhancing coordination and leadership in the sustainability sphere. Similarly, local authorities are being approached by businesses at all levels who wish to understand how they can fulfil statutory obligations and expecting local authorities to be at the forefront of these strategies.
- 6.9 HCCSP will continue to establish a comprehensive and evolving stakeholder map to help contribute to the effective awareness and delivery of the identified actions.
- 6.10 This is an evolving document that will be regularly reviewed and updated as necessary.
